As you know, City of El Segundo staff have been working diligently with Los Angeles County West Vector Control District staff in an attempt to mitigate the mosquito influx in the west side of town. We have seen success in some areas.

However, according to reports we have received from residents, there has not been a noticeable improvement in all areas.

As an additional measure, we request that residents contribute to this goal by emptying standing water on their properties, helping destroy potential mosquito breeding areas.

We continue to coordinate mitigation efforts to eliminate mosquitos at the Hyperion facility, and we thank you for helping us and your neighbors by ensuring we are all working toward the same goal.

Mosquito Checklist

The following list details potential sources of standing water. Removing these will help eradicate mosquito breeding areas.

Common Household Items:

- Any containers capable of holding water
- Buckets, watering cans, drinking glasses and cups, pet water bowls, potted plant saucers
- Old tires
- Tarps, plastic covers, sandbox covers
- Garbage cans, barrels, recycling bins
- Rain barrels

Building Structures:

- Dripping outdoor faucets
- Window air conditioners

- Drainage ditches, low-lying or clogged areas
- Gutters
- Hollow fence posts without caps
- Playground equipment
- Sump pumps
- Under decks and porches

Backyard/Garden:

- Base of patio umbrellas
- Bird baths
- Ornamental ponds/fountains
- Outdoor grills
- Flower vases/potted plants
