

# How to Prevent Stormwater Pollution

## -Automotive and Gasoline Facilities-



When draining fluids from vehicles, keep oil, antifreeze, transmission fluids, and other fluids in separate sealed storage containers for recycling and disposal. Store fluids inside or in covered (roofs, tarps) and contained (curbed, bermed) areas where spills will not wash into drains, landscaping, or off of the property. Do not pour liquid wastes into drains, sinks, or storm drain inlets.



Clean up spills immediately and with dry methods (kitty litter, rags, brooms, etc.). Do not wash down spills or pavements into the street or into storm drain inlets. Dispose of cleaning supplies and rags according to proper hazardous waste disposal methods.



Store parts and equipment inside or in covered (roofs, tarps) and contained (curbed, bermed) areas, to protect them from rainwater. Place drip pans under all vehicles and equipment. Regularly monitor and empty drip pans and fluid containers.



Clean parts and equipment indoors and in approved designated areas only. Obtain approval from the City of El Segundo to discharge any wash waste into the sanitary sewer system.
